Prior to the Quarterly Meeting an AD Hoc Committee was approved by the Board via E-vote. The Committee will address the issues with Equestrian Medical Monitoring Program of proposed increased fees per rider but more importantly their use of \$1.5 million in reserve funds from 2015 -2020 to cover expenditures in the budget. This is a multi-faceted problem that the committee will be addressing directly with CDFA and may need to push on to contact various legislators relating to the Ag industry for answers.

For those in the LA area- looks like some big names are coordinating the effort to stop the animal rights people from influencing the Board of Supervisors to outlaw the Rodeo in LA area. Be aware - it does not stop at one location; don't let them get a foothold in this distorted action.

While we are now in a climate of uncertainty, changing everyday globally, CSHA hopes to stand firm in providing our programs and remain a constant in the horse community.

CSHA CHARITABLE TRUST

At the CSHA January Quarterly in Santa Nella, the CSHA Charitable Trust presented a report to update all of the scholarship programs on their current fund levels. The Trust also announced a new fund, the "Emergency Equine Assistance Fund" or EEAF. With the destructive wildfires ravaging our state, in-field veterinary response teams are critical to the survival of many animals. Many advances in emergency triage have been developed in the field responding to these disasters. The UC Davis Veterinary Emergency Response Team or VERT is one of those units. They have responded to recent devastating wildfire disasters such as the Tubbs, Camp, Kinkade Fires and many others.

This U.C. Davis program as well as others rely on donor support and do not charge for its activities. The Trust believes donations to these teams within the state fulfills both the educational and health and welfare for our equine partners that is our stated purpose.

- **Terrain**: Spenceville Wildlife area is 11,000 acres of beautiful rolling hills with easy to moderate terrain and great views. Saturday's ride is the longer trail with about 4+ miles and 10 obstacles. Sunday's ride is a shorter ride about 3-4 miles with 8 obstacles.
- **Camping** \$20.00 per night/per rig. You must haul in your own water. There are no pens available. Camping will be in a beautiful open field.
- Awards: Ribbons given through 6th place. Awards through third place.
- Raffle prizes will be announced on Sunday after the ride.
- **Directions** The Spenceville Wildlife Area is north of Lincoln, north of Camp Far West Lake, east of Marysville. It is off Chuck Yeager Road just south of the Waldo Road intersection. **From Sacramento**, to Marysville take highway 20 towards Grass Valley. 


DRILL TEAM

The beginning of a new year means try-outs for many of our CSHA Drill Teams. New members are added and begin a journey that they would never have imagined. Drill is one of the few equestrian sports that is team-oriented. This provides team members with a way to enjoy their horses and make life long friendships with other teammates that they will spend a lot of time with throughout the coming year. Hours in the arena, on the ground, fundraising, and traveling to competitions create either lasting bonds or potential prison sentences.

The CSHA CA State Championships will once again take place at the Diamond Bar Arena in Ceres, on May 7-8th, 2022. We have added a "Buckle Challenge" to the mix this year. Teams competing towards the Grand Champion title may enter an additional compulsory drill with the outcome from that ride being added into their other scores to determine a "Super Champion". The super champs will take home matching buckles for their team. A compulsory drill is a pre-designed drill in which every team performs the same drill set at their own speed, with their own music selection. It gives the judges a unique opportunity to really focus on the execution and not the maneuvers.

Traveling with a team to a competition is a big production, and a costly one. It's not like picking your favorite show shirt out of the closet and putting your horse in the trailer and taking off to a show. There are matching uniforms and tack to purchase. You need to feed and coordinate a team of people and their ground crews for 3-4 days. To assist our teams in fundraising, CSHA Drill Team Program annually puts on a **Spring Raffle**. The raffle is a no cost or liability to the teams. We provide the tickets and prizes, and handle the paperwork. Teams get out and sell and for every ticket sold



bank credit to pay their competition expenses like entry fees, stalls, facility and RV fees. Some of our teams have covered all of these costs for their State Championship event through this raffle. The winning tickets will be drawn at the State Championships with this years prizes being a \$600 Disney card and a 50" TV or a \$500 Amazon gift card.



At out January Quarterly meeting we discussed the upcoming State Championships and the purchasing of awards for it. Our longtime ribbon supplier is no longer making custom rosette ribbons so we had to get some bids from new vendors. We got our purchase order requests approved at the Board of Directors meeting later in the day for ribbons, trophies and buckles and orders have been placed.

We also discussed how to better work with junior judges during a competition to make sure everyone gets the maximum benefit out of the day. We expect to have two junior judges at our May event. Just riding drill unfortunately does not magically make a great judge. The multi-tasking and analytical skills are something that can take years to perfect and not everyone is cut out for it. Without those unbiased, knowledgeable judges, we know we cannot have great events. CSHA has amazing judges, we just need a few more of them.

ROYALTY

In January the Royalty program presented some very important awards. The very special new matching royalty crowns arrived for crowning this year.

Only one young lady in the history of CSHA has won all three titles of our Royalty program, including the Little Miss (2013), Jr Miss (2015), and Miss CSHA (2019) titles. That triple crown achievement belongs to Mary Homicz of Region 18. In January she was presented with some special awards to celebrate and commemorate her special accomplishment.

Region 18 Junior Miss and State 1st Jr princess Kiana Kinnie was awarded a trophy buckle for the most sponsor money raised this year.

Also in January our Junior Miss CSHA Gracelyn Hayes and Little Miss Quincee Hilton represented CSHA at the Red Bluff Bull & Gelding Sale. Quincee also ran into a sash
