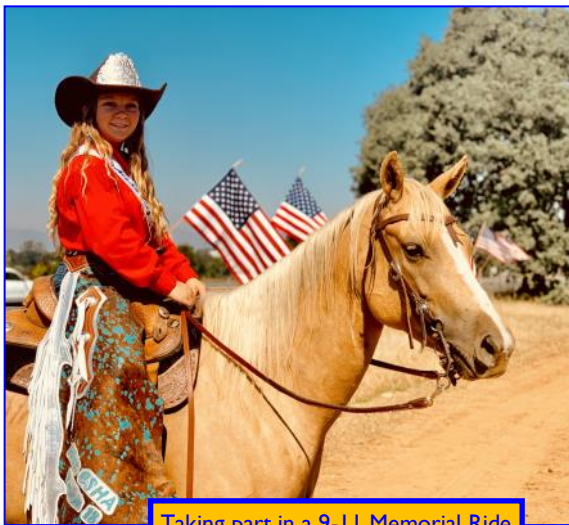

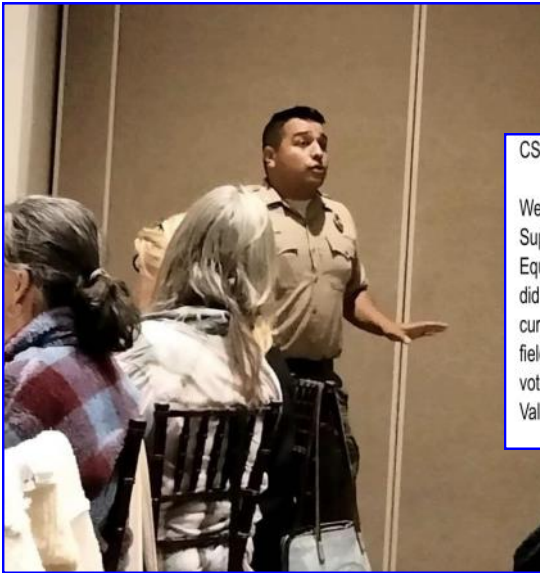
ROYALTY
