EARLY DAYS

Through much of its history, the Parade Program ran its high point program from August 1 through July 31 of the following year. The first parade high point season was an abbreviated one running from Spring 1971 through July 31, 1971. The earliest known copy of the Parade High Point Bulletin is dated June 1971 (see below). Interestingly enough, there are a few names in the point standings that might be recognized today.

<u>Judy Kmeiciak</u> rode in Silver Mounted that year and later moved into Parade Horse. She has also ridden in Color Guard, Mounted Group and now in Matched Pairs. Many might recognize her better as <u>Judy</u> <u>West</u>. I believe Judy has "seniority" as the longest "riding" Parade Program participant.

<u>Pam McLain</u> rode Spanish Costume Lady that year and many years after. While no longer riding with the Parade Program, she has remained active in CSHA in many capacities including Region President and Southern Area Vice President.

<u>Steve Herrera</u> rode in Spanish Costume Man that year and later in Silver Mounted, as well as Authentic Novelty Costume. He obtained his Parade Judge's license in the late 1970s and was head of the Judges Commission at one time. He also served as a State Vice President and Parade Program Chair. You'll also find his name listed with the past Presidents of CSHA.

Rex Allen Machlan is listed in Fancy Dressed Western Man in 1971. He also served as a CSHA Region President, Parade Program Chair and both Central and Southern Area Vice President. It is believed that Rex received his judge's license in the first wave of licensing in 1971 and served as a judge until his death.

Beverly Baxter is listed in Indian Costume and also rode in Working Western in later years. Bev, from Region 1, and her Appaloosa horses were a fixture on the parade route well into the new millennium.

On the last page of the June 1971 bulletin is a list of judge applicants with a few familiar names. **Ruby Kiefer** of Region 3 was well known for "terrorizing" anyone with silver by pulling out a white glove during pre-judging and continued to do so until her passing. **Donna Thornton** rode in Working Western and, as of 2018, is still a judge. Considering that the first judges licensed by CSHA were parade judges beginning in 1971, this makes Donna the longest serving judge in CSHA with 47+ years of service.
